LEARNER-LED ONLINE INTERCULTURAL EXCHANGE PROCESS

A VIRTUAL TRAINING FOR TEACHING STAFF IN HIGHER EDUCATION

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INTRODUCTION

This virtual training for teaching staff in higher education is offered to support your virtual international collaboration, or *VIS*, project(s). This is part of the programme 'Virtuele Internationale Samenwerking in het Hoger Onderwijs', offering activities in support to higher education professionals who are developing *VIS* projects.

'Adding impact to your collaborative, learner-led online intercultural exchange process' is an advanced training designed for those who already have previous experience in designing and implementing international virtual collaboration, COIL, Virtual Exchange in any shape or form. In the four training modules, participants will gain a deeper understanding of designing and evaluating an effective collaborative, learner-led online exchange process. The training also focuses on how to ensure a quality learner experience and measurable impact through monitoring and evaluation. Additionally, during the training there are opportunities for reflection on facilitative teaching, and educator's role in the collaborative learning process.

The training consists of different synchronous and asynchronous components, all taking place online. The total training time is estimated at 16-18 hours, including 2-2,5 hours weekly self-study plus 2 hours of weekly synchronous training time, over a period of 4 weeks. In the four training modules, participants will gain a deeper understanding of designing and evaluating an effective, collaborative, learner-led online exchange process.

By the end of the training, participants should be able to design and facilitate a *VIS* project that fosters intercultural learning, group collaboration, and meaningful learner experiences. They will also gain insights into monitoring and evaluating the impact of *VIS* projects, as well ensuring meaningful learner experience through strategies of quality assurance.

Participants will also gain first-hand experience with the tools covered in the training through collaborative, action-oriented assignments and exercises focussing on the design and implementation of *VIS* projects.



TRAINING OBJECTIVES

- Understand the principles and benefits of Virtual Exchange pedagogy in the context of Virtual International Collaboration (VIS).
- Learn to set tailored learning goals for a VIS project and understand how to achieve them through group processes and social learning
- Promote synchronous and asynchronous engagement to achieve learning goals in VIS projects.
- Identify the role of technology in successful design and implementation of effective VIS projects.
- Gain insights into the teacher's role in a learner-led, collaborative Virtual Exchange approach.
- Explore and reflect on the benefits of a facilitative teaching approach in VIS.
- Deepen understanding of the goals and possibilities for student skill development throughout the VIS project.
- Gain knowledge on successful quality control practices for VIS projects.
- Learn about different approaches and methods for monitoring and evaluation.
- Explore opportunities and challenges of collaborating with other teaching staff on VIS project(s).

TASKS AND ASSIGNMENTS

1) Training materials (asynchronous, on Canvas)

This is a ***paced training***, which means that a new module opens each week. Participants are expected to have reviewed the module's training materials ahead of the online group sessions. The modules consist of multimedia learning materials, reflection activities and discussion questions, are accessible through the Canvas training platform.

2) Discussion points & exercises (asynchronous, on Canvas)

The training content on canvas also include discussions points marked by 'Let's discuss', and exercises marked by 'Activity'. Participants are expected to contribute, asynchronously, to these learning activities. They are specifically designed to elicit reflection, foster asynchronous interaction between participants and to facilitate peer-learning and collaboration.



3) Design lab (asynchronous)

Throughout this training, participants will be working on their own VIS project design. Step by step they will be adding learning components, best practices and digital tools to a process design. Participants will critically assess and improve their design, as well as engage in providing and receiving feedback from their colleagues. By doing this, they will collaborate on designing an intercultural online exchange process with impact, that is tailored to the needs of your VIS project. This design lab starts in module 1, and specific instructions are given at the end of each module's content.

4) Online group sessions (synchronous, ZOOM)

Participants meet online with fellow practitioners and your trainer on a **weekly** basis for a **two-hour synchronous (live) training session**. This training consists of **four synchronous sessions** in total. These virtual group meetings will take place on ZOOM. This is the time to deepen your understanding of the training content, learn from your colleagues, and put theory into practice through interactive exercises.

These virtual group meetings will take place on ZOOM¹, in a closed session. These sessions are highly interactive and therefore **timely attendance** and **active participation using both video and audio** is expected.

PARTICIPATION AND ASSESSMENT

To successfully complete this training and receive a certificate of completion, participants are required to:

- Participate actively in **at least 3 out of 4 synchronous sessions**²;
- Complete **80% of the asynchronous tasks and assignments** detailed above; through contributing to the discussions (marked by '**Let's discuss**'), asynchronous exercises (marked by '**Activity**') and the assignments as part of the **design lab**.
